Funds have provided seasoned firewood, special baby formula for families, propane, gravel for washed out drives, culverts, bridges, campers, covering bills, furniture, and lots more. We couldn't continue to help with recovery efforts without your support!





RECENT IMPACT & RELIEF EFFORTS

- Delivered over 20,000 lbs+ of livestock feed, dog, and cat food to most WNC Counties.
- **Purchased** a trailer to deliver firewood, appliances, and donations more efficiently.
- **Donated a camper** to an elderly woman in Spruce Pine who lost her home.
- **Provided new tires** on a van for a family of eight. We were also able to help them catch up on bills.
- **Supported** several other non-profits with ongoing supply runs (2-3 times per week) to McDowell, Avery, Mitchell, and Yancey Co.
- **Supplied building materials** and **Two Stoves** for Peterson General Store in Huntdale, NC. Eight picnic tables were built and placed outside on the old foundation. Lynn Peterson runs his general store today out of a camper to help feed the Community, Volunteers, and Workers in Green Mountain.
- Cut and delivered firewood to countless in need alongside volunteers.
- Partnered with A Girl with a Truck to provide feed and fencing for a 47-acre farm.
- **Collaborated** with *United Way of Lincoln County* and *Sun Valley Farms* to provide livestock feed to Mitchell and Avery counties.
- **Donated and filled kerosene tanks** for elderly church members at Beans Creek Baptist Church.
- **Distributed winter clothing and heat sources** for families in Old Fort and Swannanoa.
- Provided wheelchairs for those in need.
- Delivered 7 Whirlpool stoves along the North Toe River up to Green Mountain and Spruce Pine.

- **Demolishing** and **Clearing** single wide trailer that was flooded and replacing with brand new home for family of 5.
- Launching a new bridge project in Marion helping with access to remote communities.
- We are working to find Sustainable Solutions and partner with other organizations to provide long-term relief.
- Partnering with CampLinn Haven in Newland, NC to provide back-toschool supplies for Avery, Mitchell and Yancey Counties.

Mt. Calvary Freewill Baptist Church in Spruce Pine, NC purchased a new playground weeks before Hurricane Helene hit and unfortunately it was washed down stream by the flooding. Their old playground was damaged. Their one request was to give their youth a place to be kids and play. Fortunately, we have generous donors and we were able to purchase this playground for Mt. While they were waiting on a room to open at the Ronald McDonald House, HopeMill was able to provide their stay at an AirBnB during their transition. HopeMill has been able to cover their rent for six months, demolish and clear their destroyed home, and provide an online baby shower for the Ballews. We can't wait to meet their baby girl.





THE RAYS NEW BEGINNING

Lisa and Howard Ray lost their home to floodwaters, leaving them with nothing. Thanks to our sponsors, we have been able to help them financially as they take the next steps toward restoring their home. A \$5,000 check was written to the Rays to help with the drilling of a new well. HopeMill was able to stock their AirBnB with essential items immediately after the storm along with providing their family with a wonderful Christmas this year.

TRACTOR TO THE RESUCE

HopeMill was able to purchase a new Badboy Tractor, Kit and Trailer for Hidden Cove Choose n Cut Christmas Tree Farm in Marion, NC.

Amanda and her family were able to clear one of their pastures in time for hay season. The tractor will help the Chapman's remove debris and downed firs in time for next Christmas Season. The Chapmans are very involved in the recovery and rebuild of their community. This purchase will help many within McDowell Co.
