A LIFE-SAVING GIFT FROM NEW YORK TO NORTH CAROLINA

HopeMill recently helped **facilitate** the donation of a fully equipped ambulance and stretcher from **Roxbury Volunteer Fire Department** (VFD) in **New York to Green Creek VFD** to **Polk County, NC.**

We learned about the donation through a local nonprofit. Roxbury's Chief Colleran wanted to "pay it forward," remembering the support his town received after **Hurricane Sandy** in 2012. He asked that the **ambulance** go to a department truly in

need.

Green Creek VFD has been deeply impacted by Hurricane Helene and recent forest fires, and was the perfect fit. Chief Colleran personally drove over 12 hours to deliver the ambulance and meet the WNC crew. We're so grateful for this act of service and proud to help connect generous hearts across state lines.

We're proud to have **donated** a **1997 F-150** to the **Civilian Disaster Response Organization!**

Yvonne, who we met through our weekly ARCC calls, has been helping **farmers** and

This same truck originally came from Mike at **PineView Buildings** in **Swannanoa**, **NC**, whose business was destroyed in the flood. He's been with us since the early days of Helene, helping provide safe spaces and storage.

BEHIND THE SCENES: PROJECT UPDATE

June was kickstarted by a generous donation towards our cemetery restoration project from Seramur & Associates of Boone, NC. Keith kindly volunteered his time and ground penetrating radar services, which were invaluable in mapping over 113 years of burial history. This GPR scan, along with interviews with family members, allowed us to create an updated map of the Whitson Cemetery. These initial steps were crucial in identifying which decedents remain in the cemetery today and which were displaced during Hurricane Helene's flooding.

Thanks to our donor's generosity, HopeMill was able to hire a local company to address the severely damaged area of the cemetery caused by the flooding. During this discovery phase we worked with **local officials** to search for any remains buried under river silt and debris, ensuring the cleanup was handled with the utmost **discretion**.

We are grateful for your continued support as we focus on completing this restoration work. Our **ongoing needs** include **grading, monument restoration** and **replacement, fencing**, and **spreading awareness** to help **locate** any missing **decedents** along the **Cane** and **Nolichucky** rivers.
