HOPE OF RETURNING HOME ONE DAY

Ramona and her husband were **displaced** when raging waters climbed over 30 feet, submerging the lower portion of their mobile home. After being rescued and securing temporary living arrangements, she **believed she'd never see her home again**.

Thanks to the **resilience of her community**, that wasn't the end of their story. Ramona's **neighbors stepped up immediately** pulling out the sheetrock, floors, underpinning, and cabinets to prepare for a **rebuild**. Their quick actions kept mold from taking over & **ultimately saved their home**. HopeMill is now collaborating with multiple groups to slowly piece this home **back together** so the family can return.

We've been incredibly blessed to partner with **GracePoint Church** in order to help this family. They have **housed volunteers** from Wilson, NC, and **worked alongside** us to **purchase building materials**. With their helping hands the **sheetrock** and **underpinning** has been **completed**. Next up is flooring, cabinets, and HVAC.


