RECENT NEEDS MET

In September, we were able to meet several **unmet needs** within the senior community — many of whom were hesitant to ask for help, believing others needed it more. This mindset is common in our mountain communities, where **selflessness** and the spirit of "help thy neighbor" are deeply rooted in daily life. We hired a local crew to **remove downed trees** from the storm out of an elderly woman's yard in Leicester. After losing his home, we also assisted in **repairing** an older man's storm damaged vehicle, so he could make a cross-country trip to return home to his family. We also are happy to be a part of rebuilding a family owned restaurant, Sheena's in Barnardsville, NC that has been in business for over 30 years.

HONORING HISTORY AND HEROES

Amber recently participated in an amazing program hosted by the National Park Service (NPS-NCPTT) and the North Carolina Department of Natural and Cultural Resources. This event focused on post-disaster cemetery care. It was a hands-on workshop designed especially for: Historic Cemetery Managers, Institutions impacted by Hurricane Helene, and Preservationists. Participants learned skills like documenting damage, cleaning, and safely carrying out basic repairs on historic gravesites. They even met the local bear who hangs out in the cemetery. Amber is excited to bring this knowledge to our ongoing Whitson Cemetery Restoration Project! Which we are now in the repairing headstone phase. We have an upcoming workday with Blue Ridge Monuments of Marion, NC and Gaulden Monuments of Rock Hill, SC and need your help with the following. Currently, we're seeking funding to replace two headstones for

Army veterans buried at Whitson Cemetery:

- -One dual headstone for a PFC who served in World War I
- -One single headstone for a PFC who served in Korea

Wanda and her daughter were displaced when their home was swept away by the Catawba River during Hurricane Helene. Their vehicle was damaged in the flood as well. Despite their losses, Wanda says they consider themselves "the lucky ones" grateful to have safely evacuated with their two dogs.

Over the past year, Wanda has worked tirelessly to secure a safe and permanent home. It's been a long, stressful journey, but every day she keeps moving forward, putting one foot in front of the other. One of her biggest challenges was reliable transportation to get to work. HopeMill was happy to help by purchasing a vehicle that will provide Wanda and her daughter with the freedom and stability they need to continue rebuilding their lives.

Wanda's strength is a powerful reminder that recovery isn't always about giant leaps, it's about steady, determined steps forward.

He may not have known that, after his passing, his belongings would bring comfort to a fellow veteran in need, but that's exactly what happened. HELP FOR MISS MABLE

At 92 years old, Miss Mable is still rebuilding after **losing her home** in the storm — **a true testament** to resilience and the power of community. **Her recovery** has been a **collaborative effort**.

HopeMill recently **provided two split units** to heat and cool her home, along with a bathroom vanity to help complete her space.

Thanks to Mountain Aid Project, we also delivered tile for her kitchen and bathroom.

Recovery across WNC is still ongoing, and for Miss Mable, it's been one step at a time — with support from **multiple organizations helping** bring her closer to the **finish line**.
